    - (1) Slaves were not distinguishable from others by race, speech, or clothing
    - (2) They looked & lived like most everyone else,
    - (3) and were not segregated from the rest of society in any way.
    - (4) Slaves made the same wages as free laborers, and therefor were not usually poor.
    - (5) Also, slaves could accrue enough personal capital to buy themselves out.
    - (6) Very few slaves were slaves for life. Most could reasonably hope to be manumitted within ten or fifteen years or by their late thirties at the latest.
